The Body of Saints

It would be improper to finish the recognition of those who made St Paul's come to life without recognizing the larger parish and acknowledging that they really are the saints that preserved the founding of the church, and kept it going.

To establish an Episcopal church and particularly to build a building in quick fashion in the later 1800's, the body needed rich patrons—and as we have seen St Paul's had several and their names standout clearly in the records. But as necessary, is the actual congregation that pledged and gave its support, to make the institution, not just the building, sustaining. In a remarkable feat of record keeping, Amory recorded those first members who pledged their support, and that list exists in our files today—taken from a time capsule embedded in the corner of the first building. Unearthed in 1982 at the church's centennial, it is shown here as originally written in 1882.
